# **Book Donation Guidelines**

Only donations in good shape without damage or mildew will be accepted. Donated items are offered for sale in the Friends Bookroom and/or at community book sales.

We currently accept hardcover and paperback books written for all ages and genres. In addition, we also accept DVDs, music CDs, and audio books. We do not accept textbooks, outdated reference books, VHS or cassette tapes, and magazines.

Accepted donations are limited to one box or bag of books per person per day. Larger donations can be arranged by contacting the Milford Branch library for more information.

## **Bookroom Report**

Friends Meeting, January 22, 2024

For a full year, until this past October, the Friends were unable to accept book donations for the Book Room and for book sales.

During that time, the Friends relied on the generous donations from our own Book Room volunteers, as well as book donations transported down weekly from the Dingman Twp Branch by our bookworms, so that we could keep our book room shelves stocked as best we could.

The efforts to keep the Book Room going paid off. As of December 22nd, sales in the Friends Book Room totaled \$12,295 and the book sales held on the library porch earned another \$679.

As many of you may know, the space allocated to the Friends for storing donated books has been significantly reduced due to the construction of the children's library. But I believe we should not only be able to keep the Book Room stocked, but also be able to accumulate enough books to have smaller book sales a few times a year.

I am hoping to have our first book sale on the Library front porch over Memorial Day Weekend. In he meantime, we are currently offering a 2 for \$1 sale on selected books in the Book Room to help stimulate sales and keep our inventory in our storage area moving.
